COVID-19 Safety Plan

Our Covid-19 Safety Plan (copy available in Church) states :

1. All must be aware of content of Safety Plan.

Saint John Paul II

Born Karol Józef Wojtyła on May 18, 1920, in Wadowice, Poland,. In 1978, John Paul made history by becoming the first non-Italian pope in more than four hundred years. As the leader of the Catholic Church, he travelled the world, visiting more than 100 countries to spread his message of faith and peace. In 1981, an assassin shot John Paul twice in St. Peter's Square in Vatican City. Fortunately, he was able to recover from his injuries and later forgave his attacker. John Paul often spoke out about suffering in the world. A charismatic figure, John Paul used his influence to bring about political change and is credited with the fall of communism in his native Poland. Pope John Paul II died on April 2, 2005, at the age of 84, at his Vatican City residence. More than 3 million people waited in line to say good-bye to their beloved religious leader at St. Peter's Basilica before his funeral on April 8. On July 5, 2013, waving the usual five-year waiting period, the Vatican announced that the Roman Catholic Church would declare Pope John Paul II a saint. The announcement of Pope John Paul II's canonization came after the Vatican revealed that two miracles were attributed to the late pope. After a dying French nun, Sister Marie Simon-Pierre Normand, prayed to Pope John Paul II during her battle with Parkinson's disease—the same illness that killed the pope—she was cured. The second miracle involved a 50-year-old woman, who claimed that she was cured of a brain aneurysm after a photograph of Pope John Paul II spoke to her. His feast day is 22nd Oct.

Carlo Acutis

Acutis was known for making the Eucharist the centre of his life and referring to it as his “highway to heaven.”. The Italian teenager never missed daily Mass from the time he received First Holy Communion at age seven. He spent time each day praying before the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle and praying the Rosary. “To always be close to Jesus, that’s my life plan,” Carlo is reported to have said. Carlo was considered a genius with computers and was gifted in the areas of computer programming, film editing, website creation and the editing and layout of comics. He also volunteered his time to helping those in need, especially children and the elderly. He created the website ‘The Eucharistic Miracles of the World’ shortly before his untimely death from leukemia at age 15 in 2006. The website catalogues Eucharistic Miracles according to country and demonstrates Carlo’s great love for the Blessed Sacrament. Before he passed away he said, “I’m happy to die because I’ve lived my life without wasting even a minute of it doing things that wouldn’t have pleased God.”
